What is Title I?

Ephesus Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. All Title I schools must jointly develop, with parents and other stakeholders, a written Family Engagement Plan.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Ephesus Elementary will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. Ephesus Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Ephesus Elementary will support parent engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Ephesus Elementary School invited all parents to attend our spring stakeholder meeting to review and revise the current family engagement plan, schoolwide plan, and the school-parent compact. Ephesus Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children.

The Family Engagement Plan will be printed and sent home with each student after final revisions and approval from System Title I director, System Leadership team, School Leadership team, and Family Engagement team. Ephesus Elementary will take the following measures to promote and support parents as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

- Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is posted on the school Web site, and included in the monthly school newsletter for all parents.
- Provide monthly trainings for staff during their planning periods on strategies to improve understanding of standards and benchmarking. Staff will also share best practices during faculty meetings.
- Promote the Baby Braves program sending school information about parent engagement activities to help prepare their child for kindergarten and improve school transition.
- Share information for parents to understand the school's academic standards and assessments as well as the ways parents can monitor their child's progress and work through PowerSchool.
